- 2. Update from the CAP Board meetings
 - a. Initial response to language of draft recommendations
 - i. Board okay with the direct language of the recommendations.
 - b. City Council CAP Partner Engagement meeting (4/4/23)
 - i. Presentation well-received. Council recognized and acknowledged breadth, diversity and depth of Working Groups.
- 3. Review rankings
 - a. We want action in all of these, so not really ranking to choose, but just to inform the valuation process (evaluative criteria)
- 4. Formatted recommendations to be brought to April 27 All CAP Working Group meeting:
 - Recommendation #1: Develop program to capture current increased funding for climate-smart agriculture projects through USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service programs.
 - b. **Recommendation #2:** Restore high elevation wetlands through Low-Tech Process Based Restoration techniques.
 - c. **Recommendation #3:** Increase capacity to accelerate the rate of tree planting on wildfire burn areas and other forested areas with need and potential for reforestation.

- d. **Recommendation #4:** Increase tree planting in urban and other residential housing areas with focus on opportunities to reduce turfgrass in parks and increase shading of buildings.
- e. **Recommendation #5:** Plant canopy trees on sufficient acres to help meet water quality standards for temperature in the Yampa.
- f. **Recommendation #6:** Increase the area treated and affected by wildfire risk mitigation projects (including prescribed burns) that help reduce the risk of large, intense fires that limit potential for forest regeneration.
- g. **Recommendation #7:** Adopt land use regulations that establish or update appropriate wetland, stream and shoreline buffer widths and adjacent land uses and that avoid conversion of wetlands in new construction.
- Recommendation #8: Evaluate and develop smart siting/mitigation rules/guidelines for large-scale solar development to avoid clearing of native habitat or productive agricultural lands.
- i. **Recommendation #9:** Develop criteria for PDR awards that incentivize restoration and protection of carbon rich resources and increase outreach to landowners with climate significant properties.
- Recommendation #10: Develop land clearing regulations and incentives for protecting natural habitat for new developments in the County and in municipalities.
- k. Recommendation #11: Include strong water conservation requirements in updated City of Steamboat Springs landscaping standards and consider for County land use regulations.
- I. **Recommendation #12:** Encourage cluster development and use of Land Preservation Subdivision (LPS) Exemptions to discourage and reduce the desirability of 35-acre subdivisions and to protect natural habitat.
